

## Lord Machiventa Melchizedek on Selfless Service.

Discussion Group for October 2007.

We the Ascended Masters have a deep concern for the inequality of resources in Australia, but more than that the environmental welfare of millions of people across the globe. With growth comes waste of resources and we see so much waste. Rather than give to those countries or millions who are starving, who have little resources, food and materials are used as landfill, dumped at sea, or on land, without a thought for the climatic impact on the whole.

Australia is a lucky country they say, but in fact in Australia there is little opportunity to impact upon waste, upon how equality can come, first locally and then globally. *For example: if wheat is an over supply in one area why cannot this be utilised and given to those in need?* This would need a governing body to be the distributor of goods, but more so to redistribute what is available. There is no need for lack and millions starving if in fact the self can be put aside for the greater good.

- How can this be instrumented? How can this come about, this redistribution of goods, if not from groups of individuals putting forward ideas, and beginning a movement locally and worked on a volunteer basis.

We see such potential in coming times for millions displaced and starving without home or country.

- Who will supply for them? World monetary funds?

Not likely without a severe prompting from people on mass. But caring for one another starts with you, each person putting themselves out to see what is needed in society. Our subject tonight for this discussion group is **ego** and **self importance**, and how this overrides what Jesus Christ taught, **“love one another as I love you”**.

We see so much human potential wasted with materialism and holding so preciously to ones own time and space. There is a selfish attitude across the board so to speak.

- How many of you devote your time to looking after the greater good, the Good Samaritan approach without some thought upon how it will impact upon yourself?
- How much of your time is given to service, to helping another. I am not speaking of what is currently your occupation, for this contributes to your own income and how your self perpetuation is conducted.

We are seeing a creeping selfishness sweep across the land, with fewer and fewer who are devoting any time to higher spiritual pursuits, or putting back into service for Humanity those benefits which are taken for granted.

We are seeing a perpetuation of this selfishness, self absorption in all aspects of society, those who would not go out of their way to send food to those ailing.

If Christ were here now, or Mohammad, Buddha or any of the wise teachers would they say, *“My life is so busy I have no time for spiritual growth or the welfare on the masses?”* What we have observed is that *“My Space”* is becoming more and more of self interest, without regard for sharing, help, and time-offering for the greater causes, and this is greatly disturbing. Selfishness is rampant now. *“What I want, what I like, what I have time for within my comfort zones is all important”* and the basic premise *“of my Father, how grateful I am for all I have. I will honour you by giving part of what I have for the Greater Good.”*

In times past groups of individuals lived in communities where if one suffered all helped. Now one neighbour does not care to find a need with a neighbour and ease the pain. What sort of society, indeed world will evolve if the basic philosophy *“of be thy brothers keeper is not honoured.”*

We have a need to speak of this now so you all can speak to each other as caring individuals, with truth as your power, speak of the loss of honour of service and caring for each other. .how the greater good has been put aside for comfort zones of individuals, who do not wish to be inconvenienced.

Balance in all things is needed, but without taking care of higher aspects, the perpetual search for truth and honouring life in every day in every way, there is a poverty of life which enters, and the soul suffers. What we see as prevalent now is this tendency to do what gives you joy and have a space for the needs of self and family alone. How does this teach younger generations that life is more than what can be accomplished in 9 to 5 job for the pursuit of personal glory alone?

Humanity is impoverished now, becoming more so, for so little time and effort is placed into honouring the soul and its existence here now. So very few individuals live a life devoted to God and their soul, and how this walking with blinkers on hardens Humanity.

We have a series of discussion points we feel will benefit all to approach, but put aside the ego, for I tell you lovingly the ego will rebel at being reproached and called to task. We see this as so very needed now, to look at life as an *Essene* would, to live life valiantly surrendering the ego and self for a moment, to allow honesty to come through.

When confronted with truth, the ego does move into a position of protection by building a wall and saying, *“this is not me, I am above this, I am one of those who are above this criticism”* and I say to this, there is no one who can withstand the scrutiny of their lifetime by the soul and come out of it with joy and relief for a life well lived. Christ did, but even he looked back and saw potentials which were not honoured. Life is more than a physical day-to-day grind and personal indulgences, it may satisfy the ego, but this is short lived in the place of time and space.

Life in this existence is meant to be an honouring process every day, in every way, of the life essence you eat, and of every soul you meet, to walk through life with a continual

blessing upon your lips to say, *“I live this day with dignity, with my every effort being placed into making this earthly existence a better one for others”*.

How are you going by the way? Is your ego beginning to rebel, to fight for its existence by starting to come up with, *“I am not wrong to serve my needs first- I am just honouring my needs for balance, for joy, for pleasure and relaxation”*. Yes all of this is needed, but for life to be really well lived, can you say you have done enough?

We have watched a few battle-on trying to honour the greater good with less and less help and interest of others, because it's easier to stay focused upon the self. Self interest it is called, and yes personal choice is always honoured, free will is your gift from God, but isn't the example Christ gave one which stays with you, of his constant service. His focus wasn't on himself or his family, but focused on why he was here, and it's easy to say *“yes but that's Christ, and I am just a person with physical or emotional needs to fulfil”*.

In truth you all do have to keep balanced and find such joy as does lift the heart, but I truly am concerned by the slipping away of higher values of service, and seeing that the soul and its purpose upon this earthly existence is all important, not the self perpetuation of status in others eyes.

I am asking you to discuss these questions, and at the end relate them back to yourself honestly.

I am delivering these words on behalf of the Masters, knowing some of will be ready to react and fly into self protection mode. *“How dare I Machiventa Melchizedek criticise?”* *“How loving is that?”* I will say I am being totally loving, because I am giving you something that you do not give yourselves, or others, TRUTH. There is an avoidance of truth, a shifting and pulling away from truth, because to speak truths will shatter the comfort zones placed there to make decisions in daily life comfortable. Well I am doing just that. I am saying to you to look at yourself and be honest.

How many of you have magnified your own personal needs so that you no longer see through the eyes of clarity, but through darkened glass? I am baiting the ego knowing that some may react and dislike this approach, but through a gentle love of you I do this knowingly, and ask you to be careful how you respond. Aim your insights at yourself and see where your life is going. See that the ego affects all without exception, but in various ways.

My concern is, that these times are precious, and exceedingly important for the shifting of humanity, and those we need most are off on their own course, and that is your right, but do it knowingly, and not with the illusion that you are on course. For I tell you now, none are totally connected to your soul and this saddens us. We count upon the energies of all of you. We count upon your love and support of each other and service to God. Having said all this I now ask for truth.

- How do you feel about Jesus Christ, Martin Luther King Jnr, Nelson Mandela, Aung San su Chi, Ghandi, Mohammad, Buddha and Hypathia.

There are so many brilliant souls who have captured the hearts and minds of men and women around the globe.

- What is it that makes them stand out?
- How do you compare to these souls? And please do not negate yourselves by not answering this and brushing it of.
- What was it about these people that made them memorable, indelible in the human consciousness?
- What was it that made them stand out?
- How have they influenced you?
- Perhaps you could describe how it makes you feel to be compared to them.

I ask you to discuss these enlightened souls and leave the discussion about my words until last, for some may rebel at my words, and this I do not want impacting upon this discussion. Save your response for the Masters and me. In truth and from an open heart look at these words with love and self-love enough to allow truth to seep in.

- Can you say your life was spent fully embracing life and your soul choice to be here?
- If not what are you going to do about it?

See this as one discussion night where what you do and say influences the whole, because you are examples of the whole. Be honest with yourself and know love is the key. It is out of a deeper love I speak these words. I do not wish you at the end of your life to say, *"I wish I had been given truth"*. Truth is a gift of love shared from the heart, and it is my wish love holds you safe.

We will not be holding a November discussion group, and we ask that in December you meet and make this your Christmas party, but realise it is not Christ's real birthday (14<sup>th</sup> April) Celebrate this as a day of the year you reflect upon the birth of wisdom, when God so loved the world he gave truth into the hearts and minds of humanity.

Embrace each other as valiant souls who have chosen to come together to speak truth, and know truth will set you free.
